And you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your strength. And you must commit wholeheartedly to these commands that I am giving you today. Repeat them again and again to your children. Talk about them when you are at home and when you are on the road, when you are going to bed and when you are getting up.

When Jesus was asked to identify the most important commandment, He answered by quoting a portion of Deuteronomy chapter 6, "Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength."

The initial act of obedience that results from the love of God is the instruction of children and the work of impressing God's love on their hearts, to which Remembrance Children's Ministry is fully committed.

The Children's Ministry at Remembrance is the ministry to children from birth through 5th Grade. It is our calling and privilege to walk alongside parents to **Grow Disciples** who Marvel in Christ.

Through the foundation of God's Holy Word, we will support and enrich instruction within the family life with ministry opportunities that disciple a strong life rooted in Christ:

- by creating a community where children belong and build relationships with Christ and others;
- by guiding children in respect for the Bible, prayer and worship;
- by nurturing children in a deeper understanding of the church, the scriptures and a life of faith;
- by helping children and their families become people who live out their faith daily in service and love toward others.

To achieve this standard, our Sunday ministries focus on Worship, the study of Scripture and God's Story.

Our Wednesday ministries focus on Living out Worship, Scripture and God's Story in every aspect of our lives to become young men and women who are fully devoted followers of Christ.

To this end, our children's ministry sets forth the following goals for learning and spiritual development for children through Grade 5. As partners in their kids' spiritual development, we encourage parents to consistently practice these Goals with their children; "when you are at home and when you are on the road, when you are going to bed and when you are getting up."

I. Preschool (3 years old - Kindergarten)Foundation

OBJECTIVE:

If you're going to build anything, you need to start with a strong foundation. That's our focus in the pre-school years. We pour a foundation of the love of the family of God, His stories and worship that will hold solid as we continue to build.

- o Modeling a church family environment that is safe, caring and loving.
- Introducing God (who protects and cares), His Word and His World through worship and small group study.
- o Leaders and church members reflecting faith.
- Learning through repetition and imitation.
- o Confidence that they belong and that they are beloved children of God

- I am loved and cared for by my church family.

II. Elementary (1st, 2nd, and 3rd grades)

Framing

OBJECTIVE:

Faith takes shape as we begin 'framing' on our foundation. Not only building on God's story, but focusing on how we fit into His story. Diving into service, we work on encouraging kids to live out what God asks us to do every day.

- Learn the stories from God's Word to help children understand who they are as people of God, allowing them to live inside the stories.
- o Preparing children with these stories so they can be connected in the next stage of development.
- Show Jesus as the ultimate example.
- o Continue our journey through the Bible.
- o Begin to develop relationally with leaders and church members.
- o Introducing Outreach and Service projects, both local and international.
- Learning through large group experience, small group study, and life application.
- o Practical application of Scripture through life lessons
- Develop intergenerational relationships within our congregation, learning from a faith model that can be reflected

WHAT I KNOW:

- God rules the world and everything in it.
- Jesus came to bring God's people back to God.
- The Holy Spirit is with me.
- The Bible is divided into Old Testament (before Jesus' birth) and New Testament (after Jesus' birth).
- The Bible has 66 books. 39 of the Old Testament; 27 of the New Testament.
- The Bible is organized into books, chapters, and verses.
- The books of the New Testament in order.
- The names of the first five books (The Pentateuch): Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy
- The names of the four Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, John)
- Many Bible stories in detail.

- How to find books in the Bible

On it you shall not do any work, neither you, nor your son or daughter, nor your male or female servant, nor your animals, nor any foreigner residing in your towns. 11 For in six days the LORD made the heavens and the

earth, the sea, and all that is in them, but he rested on the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy.

III. Upper Elementary (4th & 5th Grade)

Formation

OBJECTIVE:

We begin to turn our focus from the faith we've found inside, and start seeing how that faith should look on the outside. We establish relationships that encourage preteens to form their faith with the framing we've done, and make a choice to live each day for Christ.

- Connect the dots...Pre-teens have the developmental ability to begin connecting God's stories together as one big story.
- o Recognize a personal past and a personal future.
- As pre-teens desire independence, yet acceptance of belonging, we aim to encouraging a life-long love for and relationship with Christ.
- Develop the understanding of what becoming a fully devoted follower of Christ means, and by making this
 choice they can develop a happy and healthy life.
- o Serve others in our community. Perform acts of service and contribute to missions locally and globally
- o Tell the story of faith with confidence, authenticity, and clarity
- Opportunities for special events and camp with church group to build community and experience new things.
- Make a personal faith commitment that makes their faith their own
- o Begin to discern their own spiritual gifts
- Obtain a working knowledge of Bible chronology by identifying general periods and main personalities, while continuing our journey through the Bible.
- Open to God's spirit at work in their lives
- Teach strong Christian community through relationships and witness.
- Explore tough preteen questions faith, relationships, vast everyday choices

WHAT I KNOW:

- How to use a Bible map, dictionary, and concordance.
- The facts of how to become a follower of Christ.
- I have memorized at least 50 Bible verses.
- Chronology of the Old Testament and the life of Christ.
- I know not-so-famous Bible stories.
- I know the books of the Old and New Testament in order.
- The Life of Jesus

WHAT I SHOW:

- I can read extended passages from God's Word.
- I read the Bible daily.
- I pray daily for myself and for others.
- I can worship God and Jesus on my own or in a group.
- I can find Bible passages to solve life problems.
- I try to make wise choices based on what the Bible teaches.
- I can tell others why I'm a Christian.
- I want to obey God and share His Word.
- I want to serve in my home, church, and community.
- Thoughtful and comfortable with asking questions about their faith

II. 5th Grade

a. The Apostles Creed

I believe in God the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ his only begotten son our Lord: Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead and buried; He descended into hell.
